Involved in the Installation were RW Clair H. Lewis, Jr., DDGM, RW Raymond Locke, Asst. Gr. Lecturer and PDDGM, RW Steven Buckman, PDDGM, RW Douglas B. Taylor, PDDGM, and VW Karl D. Julian, Dist. Representative.

At the February meeting the Master showed a video he had acquired several years before at the gift shop at the Masonic Temple, Great Queen St., London, England. The video gave an introduction to Masonry in England. A number of members of Star in the West Lodge were present to claim the traveling gavel. April and June each saw a new candidate taking the EA degree.

During the spring Bro. Mayo Cookson spearheaded several work sessions in addition to many hours of his own time to work on projects such as stabilizing the timbers under the building; moving the oil tank outside; painting the dining room; replacing railings by the steps and the two posts on the porch; renovating (and adding the blue background to) the Square and Compasses sign on the front of the building. Others involved included John Keithan, Clyde Rolerson and Victor Vigue.

The 65th annual Strawberry Festival was held on a very hot (90°) June 26th. The Grand Master MW Charles E. Ridlon and a large suite of past and present Grand Lodge Officers were received in due form. About a dozen brothers were first time visitors. Bro. Scott Truax was raised to the Sublime degree of Master Mason by officers of Unity Lodge with the very necessary assistance of a number of visiting brethren. A 25 year pin should have been presented to our Treasurer, Wor. Bro. Harold Emerson, who was present but somehow it was forgotten. Attendance was about 80.

For the possible benefit of future planners – we started with 150 quarts of Strawberries which Wor. Bro. Connolly acquired from a grower in Benton who seemed to be the only source in the state who had berries ready after a cool spring season. The picked berries cost \$3 per quart. 12 dozen bisquits from Weaver's bakery in Belfast appeared to be a dozen or two too few. 7 half-gallons of half & half cream and 3 pounds of butter disappeared. Also a couple of cakes and some coffee, iced tea and lemonade. The record high price of \$8 was charged for the banquet which with the good (by current standards) attendance left a small profit to be divided between the Lodge and Josiah H. Drummond Chapter O.E.S. which did the work of hulling berries, setting tables, serving, and cleaning up afterwards.

Wor. Bro. William McKenzie of Central Lodge donated the use of a portable toilet for the evening.

Bro. Mark Coleman informed us that his National Guard unit was being deployed to Cuba for a year. The duty would be primarily guarding prisoners from Afghanistan housed there.

Inspection was held on Oct. 15 with 7 members and 2 visitors present. RW Clair H. Lewis Jr., DDGM, was informally introduced. Peter Sherwood Jordan was passed to the degree of Fellowcraft.

The November meeting night found the WM, JW, Chaplain and others missing so no business was conducted.

On Dec 17, 2003, the annual meeting was held. Officers elected were: Mayo Cookson Jr. – Master, Clyde Rolerson – SW, John Keithan – JW, Karl D. Julian – Sec, and Harold Emerson – Treas. The 3 principal officers were elected as both the Finance Committee and the trustees of the Building Association. There was discussion on finances and it was voted to levee an assessment of \$15 per member in addition to the \$20 dues for the ensuing year. We currently have 57 members of whom 6 are exempt from dues. The Grand Lodge per capita tax is expected to be about \$8 per member and a minimum insurance policy costs about \$800. Electricity is about \$150 per year, and we have been using about 75 gals of fuel oil per year. Hence the expenses are close to \$1500 even before any postage, maintenance or other expenses. Also a committee was appointed consisting of everyone present to consider updating our By-Laws; the most recent printed version we have dates from the 1930s.

On Jan. 10th, 2004, we performed the Masonic Memorial Service at the funeral of Bro. Raymond Sharkey Jr. who was not a member of Unity Lodge but had lived in Knox for several years. The funeral was held at the Thorndike Congregational Church with standing room only attendance although only 6 or 7 Masons took part.

Installation of Officers was held Jan. 21 before our stated meeting with refreshments enjoyed after a short business meeting. Officers for 2004 were:

Wor. Brothers James A. Spaulding, Jr., and Harold W. Emerson, Jr., were presented with their overdue 25 year pins. After R.W. Bro. Clair H. Lewis, Jr., installed Mayo Cookson, Jr., as Master W. Bro. Cookson installed the Senior Warden – the Junior Warden elect was not present. Other members of the installing suite included R.W. Raymond Locke, R.W. Bruce Hutchins and V.W. Karl D. Julian. After the installation R.W. Bro. Lewis presented bottles of Maple syrup he had made to those who had helped with the installations during his 2 years as DDGM.

On March 17, Mayo Cookson installed Bro. John Keithan as Junior Warden. He (Mayo) has been working on the hall most Sunday mornings during the winter and spring.

April 21, 2004, Peter Jordan was raised to the degree of Master Mason. Also one application was balloted on and one received.

May 19, 2004, EA degree on Robert Stewart Gerry.

May 29 Memorial service for Preston Sargent.

June 16, 2004, EA degree on John T. Billings.

June 24 was the 60th annual Strawberry Festival. About 70 attended, 7 of them being members of Unity Lodge and over 20 present and past Gr. Lodge officers. Wor. Bro. John Ford of Star in the West Lodge told about some of his experiences as a Game Warden and the good impression the Masonic degrees made on him. After short remarks Grand Master Claire Tushe closed the Lodge in ample form.

July 18 Memorial service for Albert Ingraham.

Some more painting was done on the front of the hall and a draft of revised by-laws was prepared. The cost of operating the lodge combing with the shrinking membership appeared to require an increase in dues and/or assessments to about \$50 per member per year. The prior dues of \$20 had been in effect for about 20 years without increase. The Grand Lodge increased the per capita tax to about \$12.

Oct. 2004 only 5 members and Ray Locke present.

Oct. 27 We hosted the annual 12th District Meeting. The GM and about 20 present and past Grand Lodge officers were present. Total attendance about 45 of whom 4 were our members. Representatives of Hospice Volunteers of Waldo County gave a very informative presentation on their programs to assist terminally ill patients and their families. Representatives of the district's lodges gave short reports on recent activities.

On Nov. 17 we had anticipated work in the FC degree but none of our EAs were available. The revised by-laws draft was read and approved. They will next be forwarded to the Grand Lodge for their approval. It was reported that Bro. Wayne Packard is suffering from Alzheimers.

Dec. 15, 2004. John Billings was passed to the degree of FC. Norman R. Vashon member of Lodge in R.I. was elected to membership. Mark Coleman was back from Cuba. Election of Officers. M. Mayo Cookson Jr., SW Clyde Rolerson, JW James Spaulding Jr., Sec. Karl D. Julian, Treas. Harold Emerson, the master annouced his intention to appoint: SD Kenneth Overlock, JD Mark Coleman, SS Rodney Ingraham, JS Ronald Littlefield, Mar. Bruce Hutchins, Chap. Paul Connelly, Tyler Victor Vigue.

Jan 19 2005 Installation of Officers with RW Karl D. Julian as Installing Officer. RW Raymond Locke, RW Bruce A. Hutchins, Wor. William Hggerty and Wor. David Cairnie assisted. The Officers for 2005 were

Feb. 16, 2005, Master Mayo Cookson installed the Senior and Junior Wardens. There was discussion of the possibility of having the next Strawberry Festival on June 30 with a speaker from the Maine National Guard. Master Mayo Cookson was presented a Past Masters apron from R.W. Karl D. Julian.

March 16, 2005: Had expected a candidate but he was not present so rehearsed FC degree.

May 18 Worked FC degree on Bro. Robert S. Gerry.

June 15 Received application for plural membership from Bro. Peter Quimby of Star in the West Lodge who recently bought the house across the road from our Lodge Hall. He also said we might have the old yellowish vinyl siding on his house when he replaces it in a year or so.

June 30, 2005. 67th annual Strawberry Festival. 30 in suite of past and present Grand Lodge officers and about 60 total present. Unfortunately Strawberries and bisquits for double that number had been purchased. MW Claire Tusch and his Grand Lodge Officers conferred the MM degree on Bro. John T. Billings with excellent work being performed. Most of the chairs were filled by the

corresponding Grand Lodge officers.

July 3. The Lodge took part in a Memorial Service for Bro. Gilbert J. Keller at the Freedom Cong. Church.

Sept. 21, 2005. Conferred the MM degree on Robert Gerry. Candlelight charge by Wor. Bro. Paul Connelly who has recently sold his greenhouse business and moved to Newport.

Oct. 19, 2005. Discussed bake sale for hurricane Katrina relief and condition of building. Donations for Building Fund and Charity Fund were received. A card was signed for Bro. Herbert Abbott who is in the Hospital with heart and kidney problems.

Dec. 21, 2005. Annual Meeting. The secretary reported that we had raised 1 and 2 had affiliated with only 1 death increasing our membership to 58 of which 6 are life members not subject to dues. 22 members still owed dues for 2005. The treasurer reported that the Lodge has currently has \$6199 on hand. The Grand Lodge per capita tax will take nearly \$800 and about \$740 is in the permanent Charity and Building funds.
